

SENIOR ECOLOGIST Job Description

We are seeking a Senior Ecologist to plan for and manage projects that support habitat restoration in San Elijo Lagoon Ecological Reserve, the Escondido Creek watershed, and the Carlsbad Hydrologic Unit.

RESPONSIBILITIES & DUTIES: The Senior Ecologist is an integral part of the Habitat Management Program team. The primary responsibilities of the Senior Ecologist are to plan for and manage projects that support habitat restoration in San Elijo Lagoon, the Escondido Creek watershed, and the Carlsbad Hydrologic Unit (CHU). Activities will include management of the CHU Invasive Species Program; designing and implementing restorations; as well as grant writing, program development and team leadership.

JOB DESCRIPTION: The Senior Ecologist is a member of the Habitat Management Program team that functions in protecting and restoring habitat throughout north San Diego County. SELC is seeking a senior ecologist with demonstrated proficiency in managing and designing restoration projects, grant and restoration plan writing, and manage SELC's CHU-wide program

- Coordinate projects with other partners, including cities, agencies, or other nonprofits.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

- Bachelor's degree in Geography, Biology, Ecology, Environmental Science, Botany, or other closely related field.
- 7+ years of relevant professional work experience.
- Self-motivated, organized individual with good time-use skills, and the ability to work in a team environment.
- Excellent verbal, interpersonal and written communication skills; demonstrated proficiency in technical writing.
- Must be comfortable working outdoors, sometimes under rigorous conditions (e.g. hot and/or rainy weather; dense vegetation).
- Knowledge of local habitats, flora and fauna.
- Experience with field data collection, common protocols (e.g. relevé method of sampling vegetation).
- Proficiency in the following software or systems: MS Word, Excel, PowerPoint, ArcGIS and ArcGIS Collector; working knowledge of GPS-related hardware.
- Must possess a valid California driver's license.

REPORTING STRUCTURE: This position reports to the Habitat Management Director.

HOURS: Position is regular, full-time, and non-exempt; expected to work 40 hours per week. Potential for flexible work schedule.

COMPENSATION: Salary will be commensurate with experience. Benefits will include nine paid holidays, paid vacation, paid sick time, personal time, health vision and dental insurance, and the option to participate in a 401K retirement plan with an annual employer match up to \$1,200.
