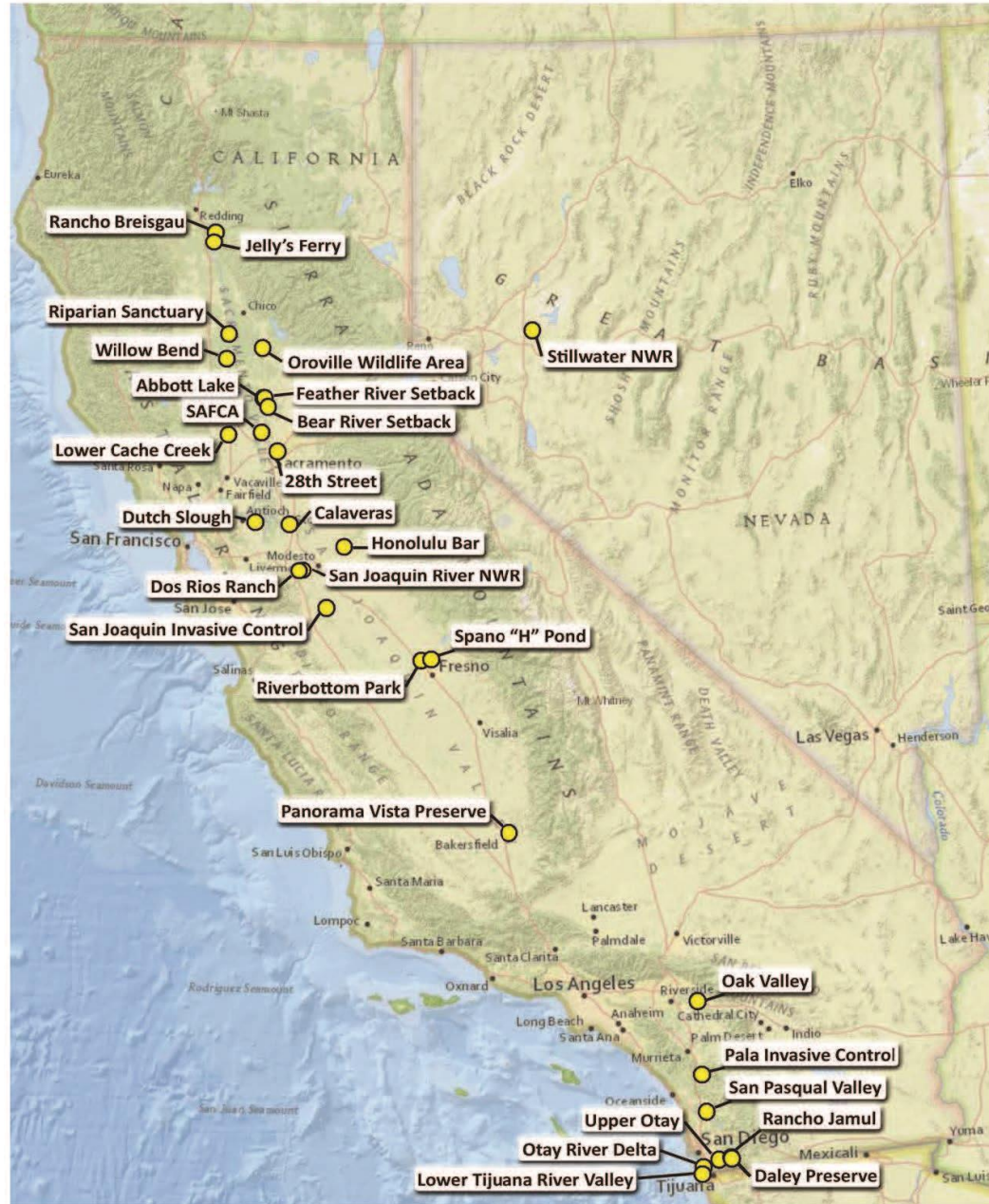
“To Create Wildlife Habitat for the Benefit of People and the Environment”
